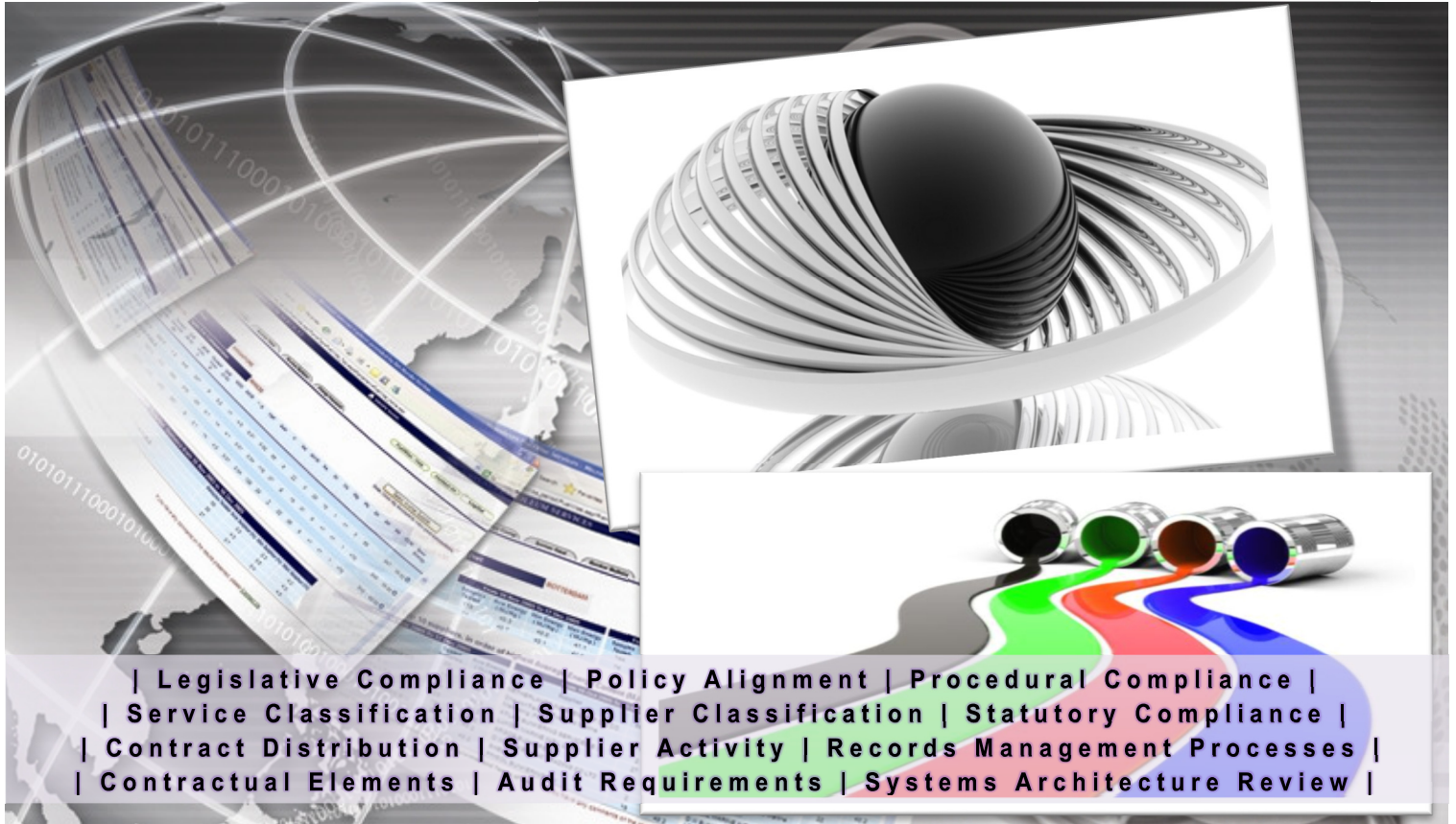

The PFMA also states that the Establishment of a database of suppliers when obtaining quotations is important for Urgent an emergency cases whereby in urgent and emergency cases, an institution may dispense with the invitation of bids and may obtain the required goods, works or services by means of quotations by preferably making use of the database of prospective suppliers, or otherwise in any manner to the best interest of the State.

A supplier database can facilitate the use of informal quotations, formal quotation invitations and emergency procurement needs as guided by treasury regulation 16A(6.4). This can be achieved in a Supplier Database that is clean, current and authentic.
